ORIGINAL DESIGNS BY WREN

This Royal Avenue property is a 3000 sq feet Grade Two Listed early Victorian five story house situated on the favoured western side of one of Chelsea's most historic squares, Royal Avenue, which was designed by Sir Christopher Wren on behalf of William III in the 1690's as part of a proposed carriageway linking the Royal Hospital to Kensington Palace. It is the fictional address of James Bond and ideally situated just off The Kings Road within an easy walk of Sloane Square and Sloane Street. bB Design House were responsible for the redesign of the interior. Originally featuring a self-contained flat in the lower ground floor, the property has been reinstated as a single house designed and extensively refurbished to an extremely high standard with many changes of layout internally, by architects Markham Associates. It has retained many of the period features, some of which had to be recreated, where missing, to match the original ones. This acted as a backdrop for an innovative contemporary design with all of today's amenities, respecting the period character of the house throughout, for which a listed building consent had to be sought and obtained.
